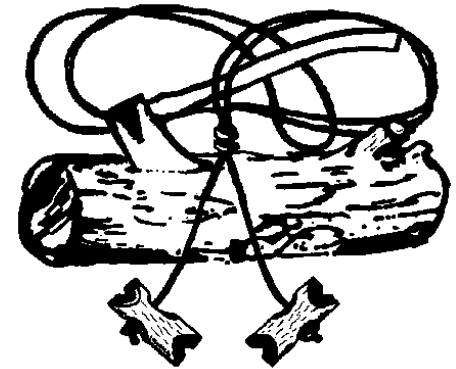

### **Who may Attend Wood Badge?**

Attendees may be Cub Leaders, Boy Scout Leaders, Varsity Leaders, Venture Advisors, District Volunteers, Council Volunteers or Professional Staff, Basically all Adult Scouter who has completed the specific training in their current registered position

### **Two Three-Day Weekends ... ...That's a lot of time!**

Depends on how you look at it. How much time are you now spending with your Scouting unit? Is it time well spent? Would you like to spend a few more days that will teach you advanced leadership skills and techniques so you may lead the youth in your unit better? Are you willing to invest 6 days, plus a few additional hours, to earn advanced leadership skills that will impact you for the rest of your life? This new knowledge will help make your scouting job more proficient and your scouting experience more enjoyable

### **Do I have to "Work a Ticket"?**

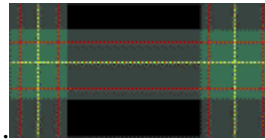
Yes, completing your ticket is required if you wish to complete your Wood Badge training and earn your "Wood Badge Beads". A Wood Badge ticket is a simple contract that you write about how you will continue to serve your unit or Scouting position using the principal and skills you have learned at Wood Badge. You write your own personal ticket to help you in your Scouting position. It is not a Master Thesis or a Final Exam: It's nothing to fear.

### **How Expensive is the Course?**

The total course fee is \$270.00. A \$50 deposit will hold your place on the course and is due with your registration. The rest is due 45 days prior to the start of the course. A payment plan can be arranged through the Old Colony Council office. The course fee includes the cost of food, presentation material: Wood Badge Certificate, Woggle, Tartan Neckerchief, and Wood Badge Beads.

### **Will I Have to Wear My Uniform?**

A full complete official uniform of your program will be worn during the Wood Badge course.
